



Anti-Bullying Policy

Introduction

At Al Madinah Online Secondary School, we are committed to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for all our students. Bullying in any form is unacceptable, and we strive to ensure that all students feel respected and valued. This policy outlines our approach to preventing and addressing bullying.

Definition of Bullying
